CP700 **Joseph Wagner (1900-1974)** A Retrospective of a Composer-Conductor. Compiled by Lance Bowling. This monograph contains an autobiographical sketch written by Wagner shortly before his death and catalog of his musical works. Thirty-four pages with photographs. Foreword by Nicolas Slonimsky, a close friend of Joseph Wagner. \$7.00

PERIODICALS

CP802 The Co-Art Turntable (1941-1943) A small, monthly periodical published in Los Angeles by Composer Arthur Lange and edited by Henri Lloyd Clement; nom de plume for Ethel Dofflemyre. The Co-Art Turntable was issued in conjunction with Lange's Co-Art Record Company and featured articles on contemporary music issues of the day as well as interviews and forums with prominent composers and music patrons of the Southern California area. It was also a sounding board for the Society of Native American Composers; an organization that flourished in the late 1930s and early 1940s. Some of the contributors to the magazine include Clifford Vaughan, Karl Wecker, Verna Arvey, Adolph Deutsch, Hugo Friedhofer, George Tremblay, Adolph Weiss, John Crown, Charles Maxwell, Raphael Soriano, Max Knepper, Charles Wakefield Cadman, Morris Browda, Mary Carr Moore, and Arthur Lange, who serialized his early reminiscences of Tin Pan Alley in the magazine. CHARTS

CP803- **Spectrotone Chart and Orchestration Guide**. Arthur Lange's analogy between visual color and tonecolor. The chart portrays a graphic representation of the orchestra and its kaleidoscopic tonecolors. The chromatic scale at the foot of the chart covers the range of the piano keyboard. Each note is numbered and corresponds to the numbers appearing on the different colorgraphs for each orchestral instrument (and their range) that are shown above the chromatic scale. Each colorgraph is divided into two parts, an upper and a lower band. The upperband represent the basic tonecolors of the instrument and the lower band represents the tone-colors complementary to the basic (Dimensions 15 x 18). Suitable for framing. Included are two booklets on orchestration written by Lange. \$12.00

BOOKS

CP804 **Harmony and Harmonics** by Arthur Lange. (Hard bound, 173 pages, 1958). The aspect of harmony taught in this book is called "linear harmony," which deals with the twelve tones in the chromatic scale and the harmonic series of overtones as being the fundamental bases for all chord structures. The book also covers the relationship between melodic line and its harmonization. \$7.00

CP810 - William Grant Still and The Fusion of Culture in American Music (374 pages, Second edition, 1996). Currently the finest single reference work on the Black American composer William Grant Still (1895-1978). Includes essays on Still's life by his contemporaries and a thematic catalog.
